

Celebrate the Keweenaw and the 45th Anniversary of Estivant Pines Nature Sanctuary with a wonderful adventure for two. Whether an expert or novice, the Keweenaw Adventure Company will provide the equipment and training for a sea kayak tour around Copper Harbor. Take an evening cruise aboard the Isle Royale Queen to view the rugged Keweenaw coastline with the chance of a spectacular sunset. Start in Munising with a glass-bottom shipwreck tour for two and a certificate for the Holiday Inn Express with astonishing views of Munising Bay, Grand Island, and, in the distance, Pictured Rocks. Week-Long Getaway in Northern Michigan

This is it—a week on Mullet Lake in Northern Michigan! This vacation home has three bedrooms (sleeps up to 10), two bathrooms, a Great Room with dining area and field stone fireplace, a ping-pong room, a deck and dock. Located on the Michigan Inland Waterway, the cottage is just 30 miles from the bridge, 15 miles from Cheboygan, and 10 miles from Indian River. Enjoy nature photography, birding, botanizing, swimming, canoeing, sunset watching, badminton and croquet. You will be only day trips away from two of Michigan's best loved islands. Head up to Mackinaw City and take the ferry to Mackinac Island for a carriage tour for two. Out of Cheboygan, two ferry tickets will take you to Bois Blanc Island for a private tour of MNA's little visited Bois Blanc Nature Sanctuary with Steward Mike White. The sanctuary adjoins the state's Snake Island/Mud Creek Designated Natural Area and includes shoreline on Lake Huron and two inland lakes with habitat for several endangered species. Sanctuary & Shipwrecks Quest

Here's your chance to get a private tour of MNA's newest sanctuary—Spitler Shore on Albany Bay in Presque Isle—led by MNA Stewards Giovanna Meek and Floyd Selves. The sanctuary features a population of the threatened dwarf lake iris, Lake Huron shoreline and, just offshore, the wreck of the steamer *Alban*y that sank in 1853. In Alpena, you can see other wrecks with two tickets to explore the famed Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary courtesy of Alpena Shipwreck Tours. Stay nice and dry aboard the *Lady Michigan* while viewing scenic Thunder Bay and magnificently preserved shipwrecks through the boat's glass viewing wells. There is much to see and do in Midland! Day passes for four will take you to the remarkable Dow Gardens, a 110 acre botanical garden. Within the grounds is the Whiting Forest, featuring the nation's longest tree Canopy Walk, 1,400 feet long, soaring 40 feet above the ground. The Canopy Walk is accessible for all ages and abilities and is open in every season. The package also includes a family voucher to the Alden B. Dow Museum of Science and Art featuring the Hall of Ideas, electricity exhibits, and more. Rounding out the Meander is a special tour of Bullock Creek Nature Sanctuary, just a short drive from Midland, guided by Steward Larry Brown. Bullock Creek consists of a series of forty foot dunes, which once covered Saginaw Valley, with a variety of plants and animals including blue bottle gentian, starflower, trailing arbutus, as well as badgers, long-tailed weasel, green heron and the great crested flycatcher. - Explore the beautiful Kellogg Bird Sanctuary with guide Kara Haas, a nine year employee of the Sanctuary and an MNA Trustee. Your guided tour for up to four people will include admission to the Sanctuary, the use of binoculars and a field guide. The two hour experience will take you along paved and hard packed paths to explore the shore of Wintergreen Lake, looking for and learning about the waterfowl, gamebirds and birds of prey on exhibit and in the wild at the Sanctuary. This tour can take place anytime of the year, mid-May-June is great if you are interested in seeing goslings and cygnets and October-November is a good time for migrant waterfowl.
- Visit the Air Zoo Aerospace and Science Museum, Michigan's premier aviation and science center, with four general admission tickets. Voted "Best Place to Spend a Day with Your Family" three years in a row, the Air Zoo features more than 50 rare and historic aircraft, amusement park-style rides, Full-Motion Flight Simulators, as well as historical exhibits and educational activities.
- Feed giraffes, take a wilderness tram to Wild Africa, and ride the Z.O. & O. This 72 acre sanctuary boasts a fine example of a mesic-northern compound mix of deciduous trees with scattered hemlocks. Waterfowl and other birds, frogs, and turtles all call

Wade Memorial home, and visitors are welcomed by an assortment of plant life, including skunk cabbage, marsh marigold, jack-in-the-pulpit, hepatica, blue flag iris, trailing arbutus, and dogwood, among others. The beautiful lake views and varied plant life make Wade Memorial Nature Sanctuary a destination for visitors looking to experience nature!

The journey begins with a short cruise up the channel along Washington Park in New Buffalo. Then sit back and relax as you pass the lighthouse and enter the cool waters of Lake Michigan for expansive views of the shoreline and the Indiana Dunes. Spend a spring morning or afternoon with MNA on a private, guided tour of the exquisite Trillium Ravine Nature Sanctuary just 33 miles away in Niles! Newaygo Prairie Guided Hike

Join Sarah Pregitzer and Randy Butters, MNA Newaygo area gurus and 2018 Volunteers of the Year, on a guided hike through Coolbough Natural Areas. Coolbough is an excellent example of a community focused partnership project in an area with very high conservation value and interest. It is owned by Brooks Township, and jointly managed by The Nature Conservancy and MNA. This Newaygo gem contains over 400 acres of natural forest with rare plant communities including white pine-white oak savanna, white pine-white oak forest, remnants of dry sand prairie, and Bigelow Creek's excellent aquatic and riparian habitat. Several animals can be found on the property, including Blanding's turtle, Eastern box turtle and many other herptiles. Many butterflies and skippers call Coolbough home, including the federally endangered Karner blue butterfly. Prairie smoke, wild lupine, prickly pear cactus, blazing stars, big and little bluestem, and many other prairie plant species can also be found here. Come and see the beauty that Coolbough Natural Areas and the Newaygo area have to offer!

The visit can take place Spring through Fall. During the spring and fall you can enjoy the diversity of birds that migration brings to Michigan. In the summer you will see and hear the breeding birds as they raise their young and defend their territories. Discover the unique habitat requirements of this rare songbird that almost exclusively breeds in Michigan. You will meet in Grayling and explore sites of interest to see the Kirtland's warbler and its bird "associates". This is an extraordinary opportunity to accompany an expert birder, scientist, and 2018 Edward G. Voss Conservation Science Award recipient who works internationally to help with the successful recovery of the Kirtland's warbler.

Prairie Restoration Lab Tour

See first-hand how research conducted at MNA nature sanctuaries is informing the science of prairie restoration with this one hour, guided tour of the lab and greenhouse of Dr. Emily Grman (Eastern Michigan University Department of Biology) for up to four people. We will look through the microscope at important plant mutualists (mycorrhizal fungi) colonizing the roots of prairie plants. We'll investigate some of the differences between remnant and restored prairie soil and plant communities. We'll also take a look at some ongoing experiments to understand what determines the outcomes of prairie restorations, including differences in soil microbial communities and environmental conditions. (Winning bidder will make arrangements with Dr. Emily Grman. Note—wear closed toe shoes and long pants in the lab.)
